Natuf seeks to support community development in Palestine generally and Gaza Strip particularly, it aims to contribute in securing healthy and sound community environment through progressing development in the field of environment and community development.

Natuf has been founded as a response to the existing environmental problems that the Palestinian society endures due to the absence of environmental awareness, lack of infrastructure and limited green spaces. Additionally, it yearns to push forward the wheel of community development by taking part in fighting poverty and unemployment in the Strip.

Natuf work is represented in searching for and finding ideal sustainable environmental solutions to combat hindrances of environment and development in Gaza Strip, Moreover, it encourages awareness programs and researches that contribute to create clean environment and puts plans and strategies necessary to improve the environmental, social and economic situation of the Palestinian society.




They also contributed to empowering me economically." Yousefsaid.

Yousef added, "The Program offered me all the needed equipment and tools to master professional photography. Additionally, it provided me with specialized training in this domain."

He stressed that Wajd secured for him a vivid future full of work and innovation; he said "Wajd Program opened the way for me to achieve my dream of mastering photography."

Wajd program is part of the project that aims to improve the economic conditions of young orphans due to 2014 aggression on the Gaza Strip and their families -the third year. It is supervised by Taawon (Welfare Organization) and funded by Qatar Fund for Development (QFFD), Hashim Alshawwa Waqif Fund and Bank of Palestine and implemented by Natuf.



He stressed that his daughter's health conditions became better upon moving her to the house to receive her treatment. This happened after installing a solar lighting system. He said: "We took Amaal home when Taawon and Natuf visited our house and installed the lighting system. The electricity is regularly available now which had a positive impact on Amaal's health and psychological conditions. Now, she plays with the other kids at home and this also alleviated our suffering."
